A rain garden was installed on Village Property.



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

The Village will seek funding in support of good housekeeping operations. It will continue annual inspections and removal of materials from structures. The Village will decommission their existing salt storage facility and construct a small salt storage building for emergency purposes, but will continue to use Nassau County's salt storage facility.

B. Briefly summarize the observations that indicated the overall effectiveness of this Measurable Goal.

Storm drains were inspected and cleaned on an annual or weekly (4 hot spot locations) basis. Over 80 cubic yards of debris was collected from street sweeping and catch basin and storm drain cleaning operations. 11 filter bags and 102 oil booms were replaced during the cleaning of 102 catch basin filters and 6 storm drains. The Village purchased a sweeper in February and used it to remove additional material from Village streets and to remove e-waste and material. The Village removed their Salt Storage Facility and is investigating construction of a small facility.
