

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



Storm drains were inspected and cleaned on an annual or weekly (4 hot spot locations) basis. 10 filter bags and 102 oil booms were replaced during the cleaning of 104 catch basin filters. Approximately 48 tons of sweepings were collected. The Village continued to contract with Fleet Wash to wash trucks on-site. All water is isolated, contained and removed from the premises. The Village required Fleet Wash to provide a Third Party Certification.
