

The Village plans to install three new Raingardens on Village property with the assistance of Nassau County Soil Water Conservation District. The Bayville Environmental Conservation Commission plans to host an Earth Day event and continue to embark on clean water projects. The Village will host a Community Shellfish Gardening Public Information Session. The Village is considering a Winter Kelp project to mitigate damaging impacts of acidification on marine life.

The Village continued to inform residents about stormwater pollution through information on kiosks, in the Village Hall, in the Village's Newsletter and on the MS4 webpage and reported activities of the OBCSHPC at the Board of Trustees meetings. The OBCSHPC engaged families in the Community Shellfish Gardening Program to raise 1,000 oysters each (85,000 total) to increase awareness of and involvement in water quality issues affecting the water body.

The Village will seek funding in support of good housekeeping operations. It will continue annual inspections and removal of materials from structures and will provide additional drainage structures at the Village offices.

B. Briefly summarize the observations that indicated the overall effectiveness of this Measurable Goal.

Approximately 38.25 tons of sweepings were collected. The Village continued to contract with Fleet Wash to wash trucks on-site. All water is isolated, contained and removed from the premises. The Village required National Wash Authority to provide a Third Party Certification. The OBCSHPC implemented a comprehensive Pet Waste Management Program including sponsoring Pet Waste Stations in the Village of Bayville. The Village retained Fabco Industries to perform catch basin inspections/cleanings. The Village has confirmed Fabco will perform inspections early in the next reporting period.

The Village will continue to seek funding in support of good housekeeping operations. The Village will continue annual inspections, removal of materials from structures and prohibit the use of fertilizers and pesticides on public property. The Village will seek out additional stormwater training on Good Housekeeping for municipal employees and will plan to enhance record-keeping of all self-assessments performed at municipal facilities and operations. As a long term goal, the Village is looking to install shoreline stabilization plantings and undertake a wetland restoration project to improve water quality in the Long Island Sound by reducing the pollutants carried by stormwater runoff.
