Dumpsters must not be used for food or household garbage, adhesives, car batteries, hazardous materials, household cleaners, oil, fuels, propane tanks, railroad ties, paint cans or tires.

Chapter 46. Peace and Good Order

Article III. Temporary Storage Containers and Dumpsters

§ 46-16. Definitions.

As used in this article, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

DUMPSTER

Any container for the collection of garbage, refuse or rubbish with four cubic yards of capacity or larger.

TEMPORARY STORAGE CONTAINER

Any container, intended for the purpose of storing or keeping household goods and other personal property, that is intended to be filled, refilled or emptied while located outdoors on a residential property and later removed from the property for storage off site.

§ 46-17. Permit required; general regulations; enforcement; violations and penalties.

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to place, keep or maintain any temporary storage container or dumpster on any property without securing a permit.
- B. Any person desiring a permit to place or maintain a temporary storage container or dumpster shall file an application with the Village Clerk, which application shall then be reviewed and either approved or disapproved by the Building Inspector or his duly authorized representative. The form for this application is to be furnished by the Village Clerk and shall be sworn to and filed by the applicant with the Village Clerk, along with an application fee. The Board of Trustees, from time to time, may change such fee by a duly adopted resolution.
- C. A temporary storage container or dumpster may not be more than 120 square feet and may be no more than eight feet in height and may not block, hinder or impede the flow of vehicular or pedestrian traffic.
- D. The temporary storage container or dumpster shall be set back from any side yard a minimum of three feet, from the front yard by a minimum of three feet, and also be a minimum of three feet away from any structures on the property. In granting the permit, the Building Inspector, or his duly authorized representative, shall consider the rights of adjacent property owners so that there shall not be any unreasonable deprivation of light, air or reasonable use of adjoining property.
- E. The Building Inspector or his duly authorized representative is hereby authorized, in the exercise of reasonable discretion, to revoke any permit issued hereunder if, after due investigation, he deems that the holder thereof has violated any provisions of this article, in that the storage container or dumpster is being maintained in an unsafe manner or is being maintained as a nuisance. Written notice of said revocation shall be given either by personal service upon the person to be notified or by depositing said notice in the United States Mail in a sealed envelope, postage prepaid, addressed to such person at the address which appears on the records of the Building Department.
- F. The length of time a temporary storage container or dumpster shall be permitted to remain shall be 90 days, with one thirty-day extension. Such extension shall be filed with the Village Clerk and approved by the Building Inspector, or his duly authorized representative, only upon good cause shown. The temporary storage container or dumpster must be removed at the end of the permitted period of time.
- G. This article shall be enforced by the Building Inspector or his duly authorized representative. Any violation of this article shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$250 and/or 15 days in the Nassau County Correctional Center.
