

The Village would like to remind consumers that backflow devices must be tested on an annual basis. Information can be found at: https://bayvilleny. gov/wp-content/uploads/2018/06/

annual-backflow-testing-requirements-website.pdf. This test is required pursuant to the New York State Cross Connection Control Program. All testing and maintenance of this backflow device must be performed by a State Certified Tester. A list of certified testers in Nassau County can be found at: https://www.health.ny.gov/environmental/water/drinking/cross/backflow_testers/nassau.htm.

REMINDER: The Village of Bayville follows the Nassau County Lawn Sprinkler Regulations as follows:

- All water sprinkling is prohibited between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Even numbered addresses are permitted to sprinkle on even-numbered dates during the prescribed hours and odd-numbered addresses are permitted to sprinkle on odd-numbered dates during the prescribed hours.
- County law enforcement officers will assist water purveyors in enforcing the regulations through the issuance of a summons which will result in a fine.

 Choose Phosphorus Free Fertilizer. When selecting fertilizer to use on your property, choose phosphorus free fertilizer to protect our waterways.
